Leo "Joe" Hebert


Selected by the Hooksett Men's Club as Hooksett's Citizen of the Year 1982

Born in Hooksett, whose legal name is Leo A. Hebert, but who everyone in Hooksett knows as "Joe". Joe was educated in the Hooksett School System, and at a very early age went to work for the Town as a member of the Highway Dept. crew. During World War II, he flew (with the U.S. Army) with the Military Air Transport people, to help supply Berlin with food and supplies during the Communist turmoil. He is the father of 4 children.

After his tour of duty in the Army, Joe returned to work for the Town. He worked for the Highway Dept. for a total of 14 years. In 1962 he accepted a job at Mount Saint Mary's College working for the Sisters of Mercy. In 1969 Joe left the Mount and took the job as the first full-time superintendent of the Hooksett Village Water Precinct. The job he still holds at this time.

Joe was involved with the Hooksett Little League for 5 years. He was a long time member of the Pinnacle Fish and Game Club. He is also a 30 year veteran of the Village Fire Dept. and is a long-time member of the Hooksett Men's Club. He is a 28 year member of the Merrill-Follansbee Post of the American Legion. For many years he has been a technician and advisor for the Hooksett Waste Water Treatment System.

Joe has spent many unpaid hours helping with problems at both Holy Rosary and Congregational churches, not to mention the night and weekend calls for help from water customers and neighbors.
